

About my book...

Northern Lights' is the first of Philip Pullman's 'His Dark Materials' inlogy, and is set in the fantasy fiction genre. Unlike many other books in this genre, it is not set in a world created by the author. but in a version of late 19th Century Oxford, England.

The book explores several themes that are impossible in reality - yet that seem so real when reading this book. It follows a headstrong girl, known at first by the name of Lyra Belacqua, as she adventures to the North after the apparent abduction of her best friend. Aided by the mysterious alethometer, and the support of several companions she meets along the way, Lyra's attempts to find her friend, lead her into a conspiracy which is far greater and gees in the very fabric of her world, and beyond. Well done to all the Year 7 students who engaged with Mrs Crawford's Y7 Book Review Easter Holidays Challenge. The standard was very good. Mrs Crawford would like to shine a particular spotlight on Olivia F's submission as the attention to detail and quality of her book review was excellent.
