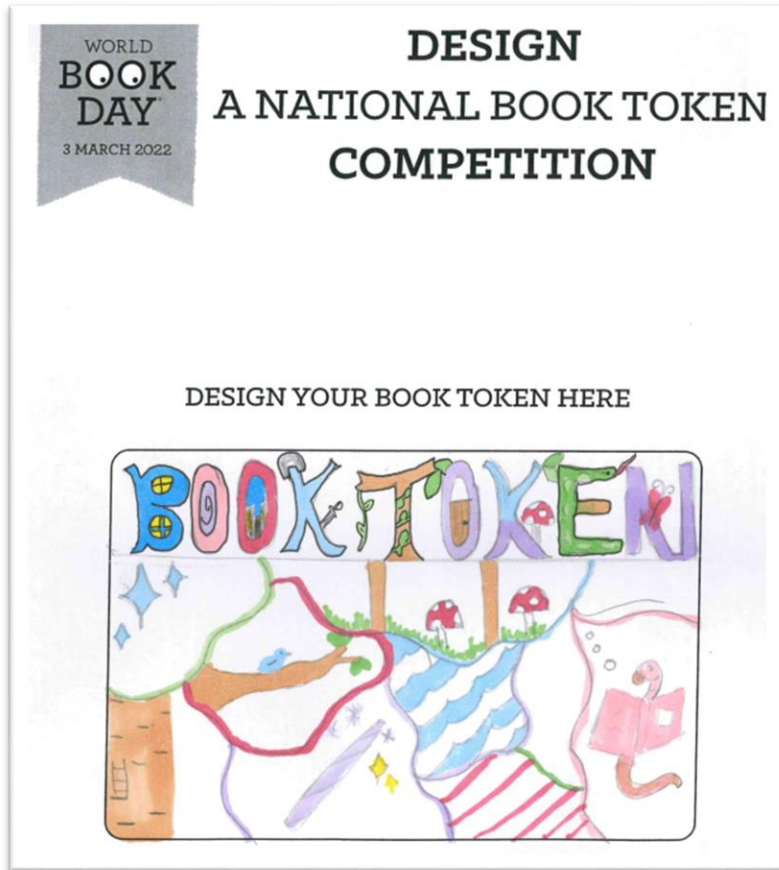

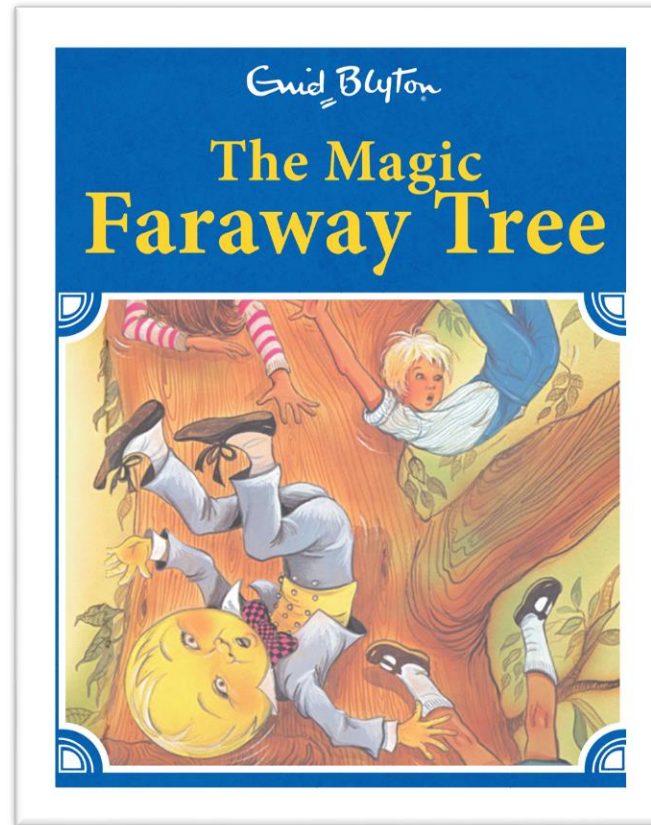
'Brandon G Y8'

Joint 2nd place went to: 'Cate M Y7'

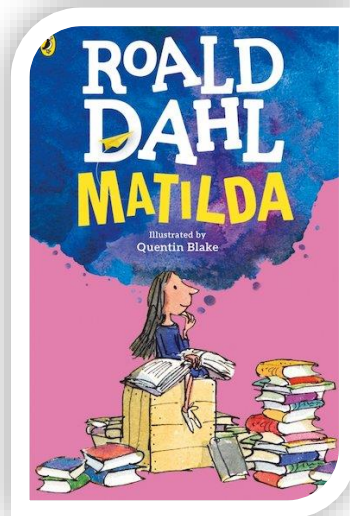


Cate submitted 2 creations featured here:

2. Book Shelf insert based on one of her favourite books 'The Magic Faraway Tree' by Enid Blyton



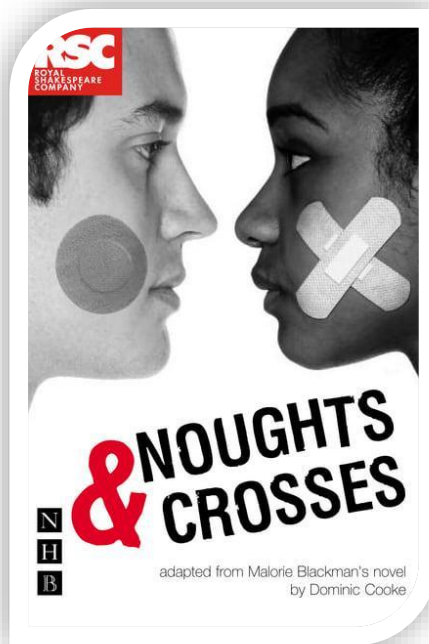
These could be the favourite books of all the children in the class (everyone could make one book to add to the door)

2. From another of her favourite books 'Noughts and Crosses' by Malorie Blackman



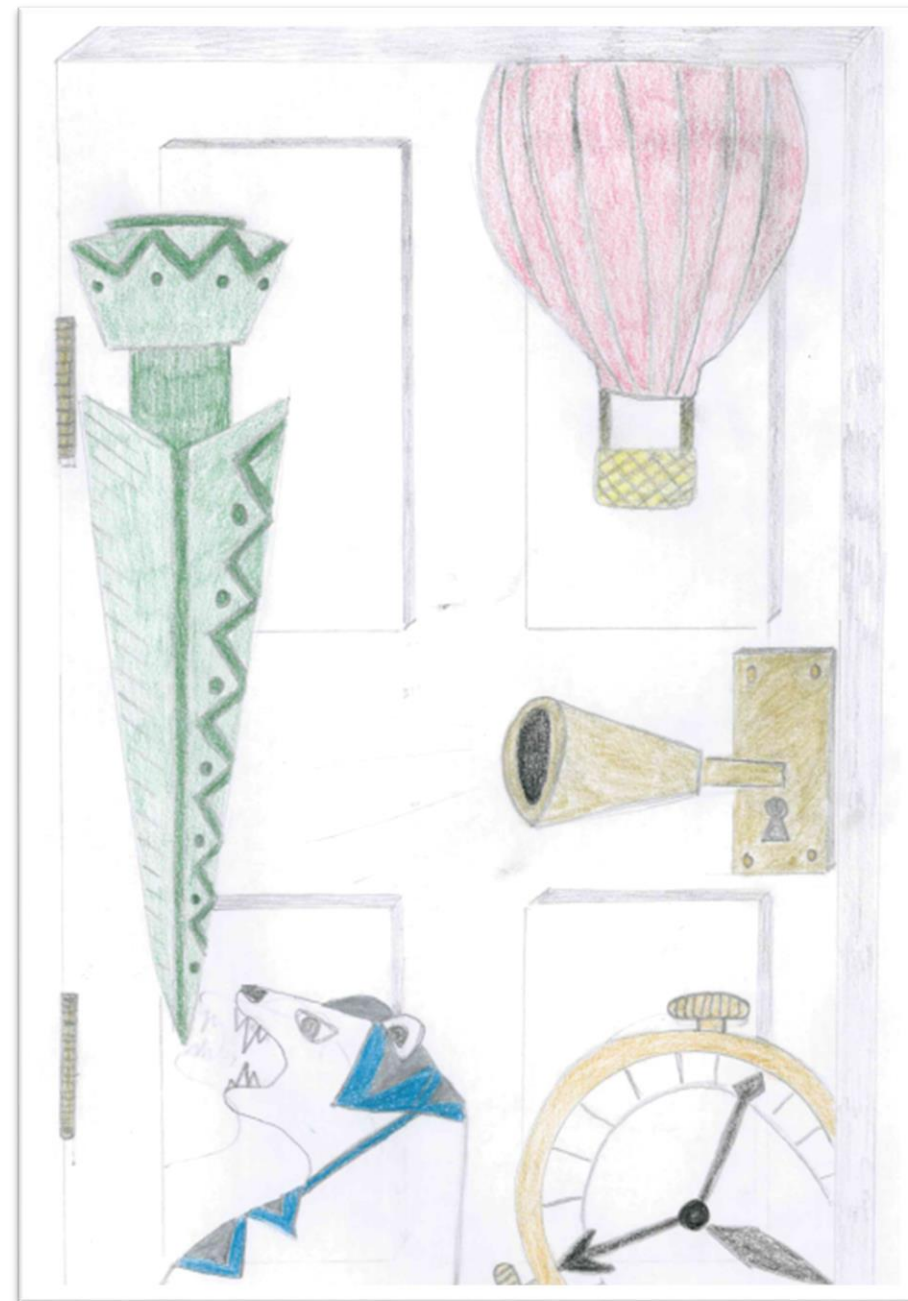

Then impact.

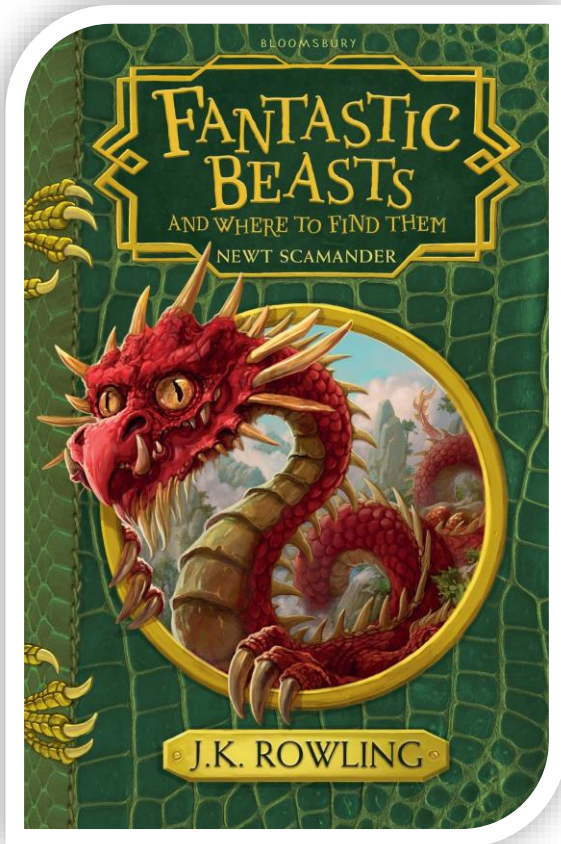
The car flipped.

Darkness.

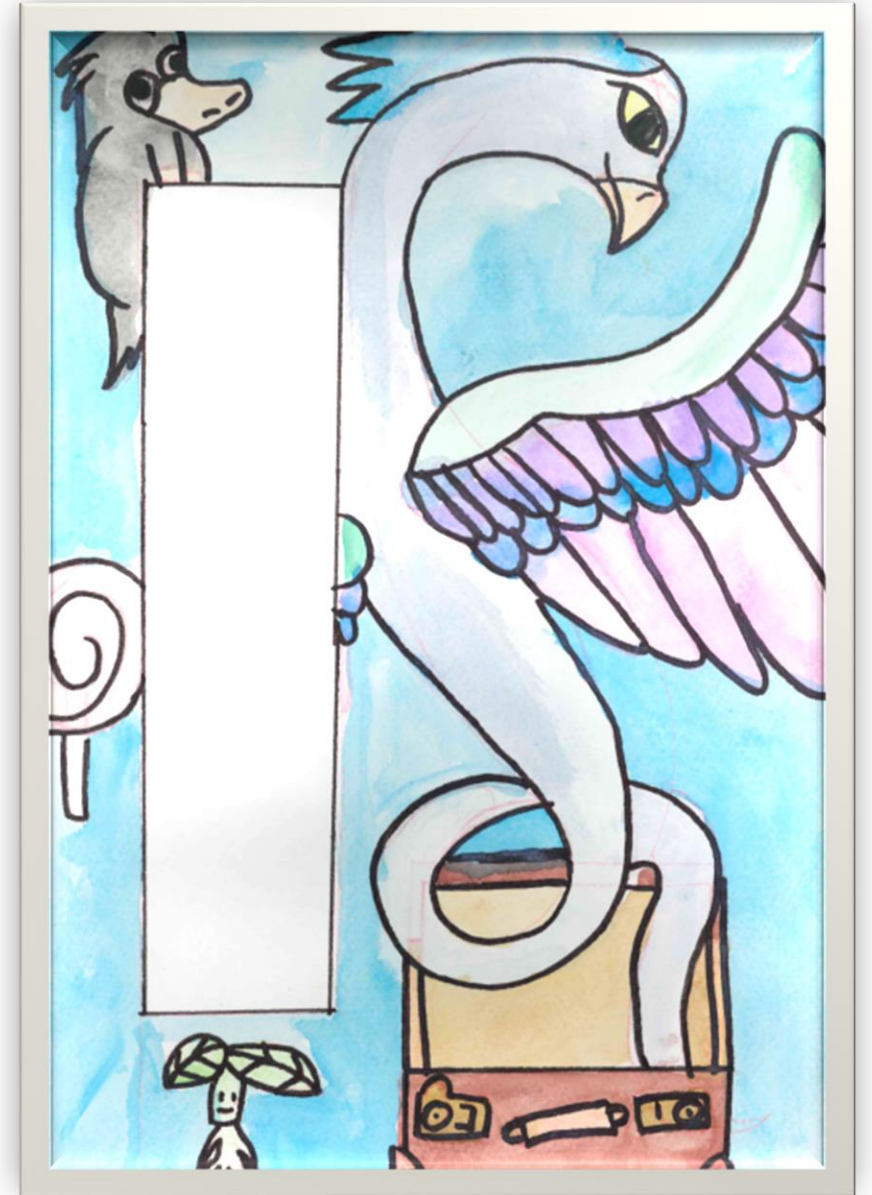

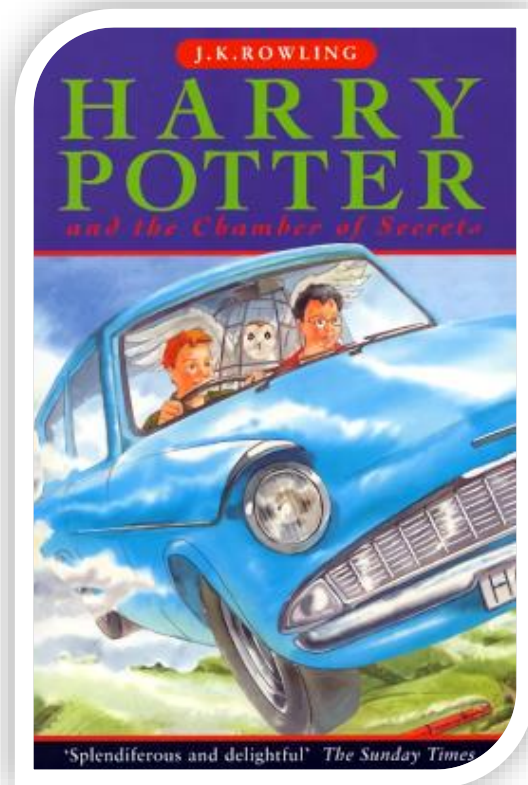

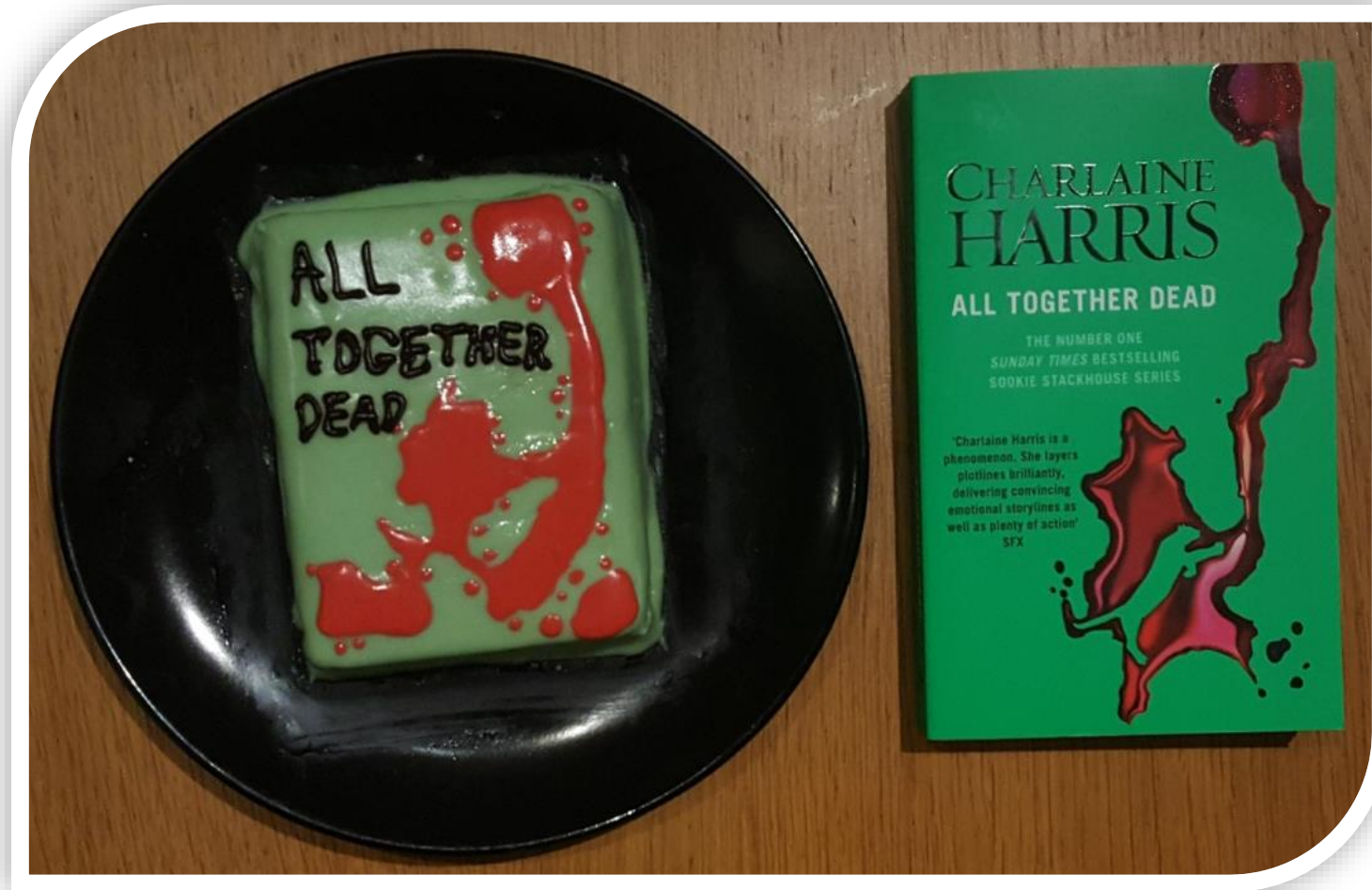
